Volunteers help to ensure a sustainable Lifestyle

Lifestyle 2007 winners Brough Babes teamed up with BBC Radio Humberside's Springwatch Action Team and community volunteers in a quest to sustain their winning Lifestyle project, the six mile Humber Hike, focusing on key areas, Brough Haven, Welton Waters and the Long Plantation Woods at North Ferriby.

All those involved sowed seeds, did some planting, placed bird and bat boxes, cleared litter and stained benches in a bid to enhance the route for walkers.

The work took place on Sunday 8th June and coincided with the official unveiling of a plaque to commemorate the Brough Babes' achievements. The wooden plaque was donated by Elloughton-cum-Brough Parish Council.

Know your speed limits!

East Riding of Yorkshire Council is urging local drivers to be aware of speed limits at all times. Motorists often forget that in built-up areas with street lights and no signs indicating otherwise, you must assume a 30 mph limit. Department of Transport guidelines forbid local councils from putting up signs in these zones, on the basis that all drivers should be able to recognise the limit. It is a worrying statistic that two out of three accidents involving death or injury take place on roads where the speed limit is 40mph or less. So be speed aware and help make our community safer.

East Riding of Yorkshire Council is calling for improvements in services for young people in Brough, by asking for ideas and volunteers.

Linda Redmond who runs the Bridge Youth Cafe with her husband on Saturday evenings at Brough Youth Hall said, "We really need a permanent facility for the kids". Linda has to set up and pack away everything each Saturday because the premises are used by other groups. She would also like to stay open for longer, but this requires additional help which has not been forthcoming.

"With more volunteers we could run more activities," said Linda, who has held art, drama and music workshops at The Bridge. She is in talks with BAE Systems, local schools, the Parish Council and the Police about how things can be improved within the community. ERYC also runs a youth club on Tuesday and Friday evenings. It would ease pressure on all these groups if there were activities on more evenings of the week.
