

Biking brothers' sponsored ride in Dad's memory

Brothers Daniel and Adam Jordan of Elloughton are organising a charity bike ride on Saturday 12th September to Whitby, North Yorkshire and then back again on the Sunday.

Adam and Daniel who sadly lost their Dad Keith earlier this year to cancer are organising the ride in his memory and to raise funds for Yorkshire Cancer Research.

Keith Jordan worked as a painter and decorator and was well known in Brough and Elloughton, having been a resident here for most of his life. He is sadly missed by family and friends alike.

The Jordan brothers will depart from the Half Moon in Elloughton early on the Saturday morning and hope to be in Whitby in time for a fish and chip supper. After a planned stopover they will head back home on the Sunday. There are still a few places available on the 120 mile round trip, which already has over 20 participants. Cycling enthusiasts and supporters are welcome to come along.

Daniel, a graphic designer and father himself, commented: "We have decided

to do this ride in memory of my Dad who loved Whitby and was a massive fan of cycling. He used to organise lots of cycle races for kids around North Yorkshire and would take my brother up and down the country to lots of cycling events".

He added: "We think the memorial ride is a fitting tribute to a great man and we hope to do the event every year".

JSF is lifted ashore at BAE Systems Brough

Regular walkers along the river bank will have noticed the huge crane at the BAE Systems' site over the weekend of 24th and 25th April. The heavy duty lifting equipment was in place to bring ashore a Lockheed Martin F-35 Lightning II also known as the Joint Strike Fighter (JSF).

After a three week voyage from Fort Worth, Texas the JSF arrived in Hull docks where it was transferred to a barge for the last leg of its journey to Brough. The airframe will undergo structural testing at BAE from late July for 15 months, after which it will be shipped back to the US.
