

## Construction of flood defences at Brough presses ahead

**In June work began on the construction of new flood defence embankments in Brough. The Environment Agency secured planning permission for the scheme in May 2010 and the work is expected to take around six months.**

£5.8m is being spent by the Environment Agency to improve protection to this area. As a result 459 residential and commercial properties will enjoy better protection from flooding.

The work is being carried out by Birse Civils who are building all of the schemes in the first package of work identified by the Humber Flood Risk Management Strategy.

Two local footpaths will be temporarily closed while the construction work takes place and a diversion route will be

signposted. The diversion route is shown in green on the map to the right. The red line marks where the path will be temporarily closed.

The Environment Agency has worked closely with Natural England and BAe Systems to ensure that the rare birds which use the BAe Systems site will be disturbed as little as possible during the work.

The work will include raising the level of protection for the airfield and surrounding land by using steel sheet piles, creating around 1,500 metres of new earth embankment, improvements to the outfall at Elloughton Clough and to where the embankment crosses Welton Bank Drain.

The work is part of the Humber Strategy, a 100-year plan to manage the impacts



of flooding from the Humber Estuary. Work identified by the strategy is put together in five-year 'packages' depending on how pressing it is.

A massive tendering exercise resulted in the appointment of Birse Civils to build all of the schemes in the first five years, which means savings of over

£3m to date will have been made compared to tendering each scheme individually.

## New speedy bus route to city centre

**Launched in April, the Petuaria Express is a brand new express bus service from Gilberdyke to Hull city centre via Elloughton and Brough.**

East Yorkshire Motor Services have planned the route and timings to suit commuters and shoppers. The service goes past Hull Royal Infirmary and through the city centre, with all journeys passing Princes Quay. Peak time journeys also pass the Guild Hall and Hull College.

With a scheduled journey time of under 35 minutes, EYMS claims that the trip from Brough to the centre of Hull is as quick as the train when factoring in walking times from Hull Paragon to the Old Town area. A return journey costs just £5 or £20.50 for a weekly ticket, a fare which certainly compares favourably with travel by train.

The service operates 10 times daily from Monday to Friday. The company says it will consider increasing the service if it is successful.

The Petuaria Express is branded on a Roman theme to reflect the historical importance of the settlement at Brough. The launch coincides with the 1600th anniversary of the year the Romans left Britain in 410AD. A new eye catching livery has been introduced for the service which incorporates a Roman charioteer. The livery

is based on the indigo and primrose colours of the Elloughton based Lee and Beulah company, one of the original companies from which EYMS was formed in 1926.

## POLICE REPORT

**Police in the Dale and South Hunsley area are urging the public to be on their guard in the fight against theft and vandalism aimed at churches.**

Since 1st September 2009 there have been 18 offences where lead has been stolen from churches in the East Riding of Yorkshire. Incidents usually take place during the night at remote locations. The removal of lead from the church roof can often lead to thousands of pounds worth of secondary damage resulting from the church being left open to the elements. Commercial and residential properties have also been targeted, including

the Petuaria Centre on Welton Road which earlier this year had the lead stripped from its roof by thieves. The rising value of scrap metal has led to a spate of these offences.

PC Richard Beeforth, Crime Reduction Officer, says "We will be asking those people who live around our vulnerable buildings to be vigilant and report anything suspicious, day or night. If you can safely take vehicle registration numbers or descriptions of vehicles and people, please do so. You may help solve a crime."
