


It's your community – be part of it!

Elloughton-cum-Brough's 'Be Part Of It' group has forged ahead with developing plans that set out a vision of how to improve social, economic, environmental and cultural well-being in the community. The group works closely with, but as an independent voice from Elloughton-cum-Brough's Parish Council.

The group is currently speaking with local residents and community groups to get a feel for local issues, needs and priorities.

The steering group in Elloughton-cum-Brough is made up of a mix of residents and representation from East Riding of Yorkshire Council, Humber and Wolds Rural Community Council and the Parish Council. Local resident and Chairman of the group, Sam Muzaffar said:

"Our first step is to find out what (if anything) the issues are in the local area and how we can fix them. As well as using existing intelligence that we have gathered from recent surveys and consultation exercises, we have written to a number of



local voluntary organisations and aim to hold several interactive feedback sessions ourselves."

The first parish plan feedback session was held at the Petuaria Centre in Brough on the morning of Wednesday 2nd March followed by another at Morrisons Supermarket on Friday 11th March.

Peter Hirschfeld, Community Led Planning Officer, Humber and Wolds Rural Community Council, is involved in guiding the steering group through the process. He said:

"Through the plan, the community celebrates positive features and activities and highlights needs that could be met through further action. Community Led Parish Plans also support applications for project-funding by providing vital supporting evidence of need."

The group would like to thank all those who took time to get involved in the sessions – their input will be incorporated into a community led action plan. Although the feedback was too detailed to cover in this article, it suggested people are passionate about Elloughton-cum-Brough's friendly village/community feel and this is something they are keen to preserve. When asked what they would change, most asked for more shops and schools and raised specific traffic/road improvements.

The 'Be Part Of It' steering group meets once a month and is looking for additional members in order to help them put together the plan. Anyone interested can contact the Parish Council office on 665600 or email helpusplan@gmail.com.
