

Playing cricket - the Stanley Jackson way

Barely had the 2011 cricket season got underway when the road alongside Welton & Brough Cricket Club was renamed in honour of the cricketer who opened their ground in 1893.

Following an application by the club, the slip-road leading to Common Lane from the A63 is now known as Stanley Jackson Way, named after England's Ashes winning cricket captain of 1905. He was the son-in-law of Colonel Henry Harrison-Bradley who donated the ground to the Welton village cricket team.

Welton & Brough Cricket Club Chairman, Brian Parker said, "I am indebted to local historian David Parker, for introducing me to a local cricketing celebrity of a bygone era, Francis Stanley Jackson".

"The club is keen to teach the young cricketers in their charge the values that Stanley Jackson exhibited throughout his life, both on and off the field".

The street naming could not have taken place without the generosity of Elloughton-cum-Brough Parish Council, Brough Golf Club where Stanley Jackson was a member, Yorkare Homes Limited and cricket club members who all responded to the street naming appeal.

The new street sign was unveiled by the Rt. Rev. Richard Frith, Bishop of Hull, who said, "Although my origins are based in Norfolk and I played most of my cricket in the South, I still retain a keen interest in cricket internationally and in Yorkshire".

Both Stanley and his wife Julia have been laid to rest in the churchyard extension of St Helen's Church, Welton, just ten wicket lengths from where the street sign bearing his name is placed. Junior members of Welton & Brough Cricket Club will be refurbishing their resting place as a project over the summer holiday period.

Parish Council goes to town!

Elloughton-cum-Brough Parish Council is now a Town Council with effect from May 2011. Bryan Davis, who was re-elected as Chairman of the Council at its May annual meeting, stated that this will reflect the size and nature of the area. He stresses that the title 'Town' is in name only and that Elloughton and Brough will always retain their individual identities. He added that there is no intention of creating a role of Mayor and the title change, from Parish to Town, will not incur any costs – it is simply an expression of status.

Although the status of Town Council will not bring any additional powers, it should greatly raise the profile of the community. It is clear that in recent years the decision making processes that affect health, education, employment and infrastructure have greatly under estimated the needs of the community because strategic planning is focused around the recognised towns. The community's population is now approaching 10,000 which is much larger than the majority of the recognised towns in the East Riding. Brough town centre already serves a wider population of at least 15,000 so it is important that the community is seen, heard and recognised.

Organised by the Town Council the event will take place over the weekend of 22nd October at the Petuaria Centre. Visitors will be able to vote for their favourite pieces. Brough plaque commemorates aeronautical landmarks

The Royal Aeronautical Society have awarded a commemorative plaque to BAE Systems in Brough. The plaque celebrates the centenary of Robert Blackburn's first flight in May 1910 and the founding in 1916 of the aircraft factory at Brough. The plaque has been placed at Brough cross roads.



The award recognises the contribution that Robert Blackburn has made to the aerospace industry. His historical first flight from the sands at Marske in North Yorkshire established him as one of Britain's earliest aviation pioneers. The factory he founded six years later became the centre of manufacturing operations between the two world wars and is now one of the oldest continuously operated aerospace manufacturing sites in the world. It remains a highly valued site within BAE Systems. The factory's contribution to the local economy has helped Brough and Elloughton grow into the thriving community they are today.

Fake Festival rocks the village
