## Five years of service

Brough's innovative Petuaria Centre celebrated its fifth birthday in August with an open day. The centre opened in 2006 and was the first of its kind, offering library and customer services under one roof. The centre also houses the Community Centre and a facility for adults with learning disabilities.

The open day was attended by local business, community groups and the emergency services with stands and information displays. The *Petuaria Press* was in attendance and refreshments were provided by Adult Services

With around 1,600 visits each week the centre and its services are highly valued by local residents. In its five year history the library has made over 140,000 loans to almost 6,000 members, whilst the Customer Service Centre has taken 17,000 payments for things like council tax, rents and railcards.

## Know your Snow Code

As the weather gets colder residents will recall the particularly harsh winter of last year. Many roads around the village became inaccessible to vehicles and hazardous to pedestrians due to compacted snow and ice.

The government has published a detailed guide explaining measures that can be taken by residents to help prevent similar problems again. The Snow Code explains how best to tackle fallen snow on footpaths and roads and includes a reminder to look out for elderly or vulnerable neighbours who may need assistance during periods of harsh weather.
