

Brough South planning decision in the hands of East Riding of Yorkshire Council

An outline planning application for the Brough South development has been submitted to East Riding of Yorkshire Council (ERYC). Elloughton-cum-Brough Town Council voted against the application and objections have been raised by many residents. An outline planning application is used for large projects that are to be delivered over a long period of time which in this case would be over a 10 year period.

At this stage Horncastle Group, working with Redrow Homes and the landowners, are seeking approval for the uses of the land, character zones and means of access only. If approved it will pave the way for further stages of planning application until the fine details are resolved.

At the heart of the developers' proposals is the building of 800 new homes which will include affordable housing for younger and older people. The proposed development will require £100m of private sector funding which Horncastle say will provide

an enormous boost for the local economy. Horncastle believe other benefits include better accessibility to the River Humber and Welton Waters, enhanced biodiversity, the provision of more natural play environments as well as the creation of many new jobs.

The Town Council's response to the application can be seen on their website at www.elloughtonbrough-pc.gov.uk.

ERYC has already designated the land for mixed use (commercial/housing development) and is awaiting further information from developers to address

various concerns. Another consultation will be carried out in early 2012 before the application is considered at an ERYC committee along with the recent Tesco application.

Town Council plans for snow

The Town Council has formulated a snow and ice emergency plan to put in to action in the event of severe winter weather conditions lasting several days.

The plan includes priorities for the clearing of roads and a rota of voluntary helpers. It also outlines the required risk assessments and procedures for hiring contractors. The Town Council has persuaded ERYC to include Moor Road on gritting routes next winter and two additional salt bins have been installed there as an interim measure. Elsewhere 18 green salt bins have been provided by the Town Council who will pay for ERYC to replenish them when they refill the yellow bins.

Residents are encouraged to keep public paths near their property clear from ice where possible. A copy of the Government snowcode has been delivered with this issue and is also available online.

Due to its sweet taste cats will lick antifreeze which then crystallises in their bladder and causes renal failure. Symptoms start with the cat being very vocal followed by lethargy. Ingestion is fatal and residents are urged to make sure that they store antifreeze carefully and safely.
