

Olympic torch to visit Brough and Elloughton Jubilee celebrations!

The Olympic Torch will travel the length and breadth of Britain this Summer and will pass within a one hour journey for 95% of the UK population. The *Petuarria Press* and Elloughton-cum-Brough Town Council are very proud to announce that the Olympic Torch will be carried through Elloughton and Brough.

Its journey starts on 19th May and finishes on 27th July. On 18th June it will travel from Bridlington to Beverley, then on to Hull where an evening celebration will take place at West Park. The torch will leave Hull in convoy on the morning of Tuesday 19th June and is scheduled to enter Brough at the village boundary on Welton Road at 7.37am. The torch will then be carried by a relay of torchbearers down Welton Road to the crossroads where the bearer party will turn right, parading up Elloughton Road past the entrance to Brough Primary School and on to Elloughton Main Street. At Elloughton crossroads the procession will head left onto Stockbridge Road, passing Elloughton Primary School and continuing past Stockbridge Park to rejoin the convoy and depart at 8.02am.

The torch will be preceded by a Police escort and pilot vehicle. Torchbearers on the Brough and Elloughton stage include former resident Emily Cramphorn and three Brough residents have been chosen as torchbearers for the Hull leg – Jack Franklin, John Philip and Linda Barber. Residents are at wits end over same old faeces

Dog Fouling remains a burning local issue driving residents in the worst affected areas to despair with many home owners complaining about fouling on their front lawns as well as pavements and other public areas.

The number of incidents reported to the police has increased in recent months and the problem has been noted by patrolling

officers, especially in grassed areas and passages. PCSO Jess Watts said, "If persons are caught letting their dog foul, a £75 penalty ticket will be issued".

Up to 40% of adult dogs harbour the *Toxocara Canis* roundworm. Its eggs are passed in dog faeces which can then be ingested or enter the bloodstream via broken skin. Infection in humans poses a risk of blindness, especially to children.

Responsible dog owners and walkers who "bag and bin" their dogs' mess are helping to reduce the incidence of contamination by *Toxocara Canis*. It is a legal requirement to clean up after your dog in a public place, although an exemption is made for those with visual impairment or physical disabilities whose dog is trained to assist them. Bags for dog faeces are inexpensive. Find out where the nearest litter bins are on your route and encourage other owners to act responsibly. A minority are giving others a bad name!

To report dog fouling when you know the identity of the offender, or when and where the fouling is taking place, call 01482 396301 with the details of your complaint.

The future of Ladybird Pre-School was left hanging in the balance after the announcement that the demolition of the Youth Hall on Welton Road was proposed for July this year. Following various attempts to find a new home Ladybird have been thrown an eleventh hour lifeline by Blackburn Leisure who have offered the use of the upstairs of their pavilion building.

The offer is still subject to contract but it means that Ladybird can once again accept bookings. Blackburn Leisure is independent of BAE Systems so Ladybird's future is now secure for the foreseeable future.

The available area has two rooms and access to outdoor play on two large balconies. These areas will be made safe before the new venue is operational from September. What Next for Common Lane?

A new development for supported housing is proposed on Common Lane, Welton. A planning application has yet to be submitted but funding has been granted by the Homes and Communities Agency and terms have been agreed with the landowner.

A public consultation was held by developers Chevin Housing Association and East Riding of Yorkshire Council at the Petuaria Centre. The proposed development is for ten one-bedroomed flats for people with learning and other disabilities. The development will be staffed 24 hours a day but will allow residents to live as independently as possible.

The What Next Housing Project is the initiative of a group of parent carers, many in their 60s and 70s, who have cared for their learning disabled children all their lives and want to take the next step in providing care for their children. They wish to provide modern quality accommodation within the local community where their sons and daughters can live independently. The Wilf Ward Family Trust will provide care support for the project.

The intended tenants of the development already live in Brough or the surrounding villages. Several have other disabilities such as epilepsy and visual or auditory impairments. All have been assessed as having critical needs by Social Services. It has taken their families four years to get the What Next project to this stage after pursuing other options such as using the old Welton School Building which fell through. David Watson from What Next who is also a carer said, "There is a real need for this project to go ahead".
