

Help Village Hall to raise the roof funds

Elloughton-cum-Brough Village Hall is threatened with closure after almost eighty years at the centre of community life. Due to its age and general wear and tear the roof is now in urgent need of repair at an expected cost of £23,000.

Since 1935 the Village Hall has nestled quietly behind what is now Elloughton Road. The hall is used every day and evening by a variety of local clubs and voluntary associations. It provides facilities for residents of all ages from pre-school children to retired people and remains one of the village focal points.

The cost of repairing the building's roof is going to be considerable but it would be a great loss to the community if the hall had to close. To prevent this from happening the Village Hall Committee is urgently planning and undertaking fund raising projects and we hope you can help.

Over the next few months posters advertising fund raising events will appear around the village. Some events are planned already including concerts at the hall, "sponsor a tile" and craft fairs. Keep your eyes open for details of more fund raising

events to be published soon.

Fund-raisers make a 10,000 foot jump

In the summer issue of *Petuaría Press* we reported that Brough teenager Adam Holmes was planning to undertake a charity skydive. His objective was to raise funds for Multiple Sclerosis on behalf of family friend Carole Warren.

Carole came up with the idea of making a parachute jump two years ago but then became too ill to make the jump herself. Adam took on the challenge and when the time came Carole actually completed the jump together with Adam in July.

Both of them were strapped to instructors from Skydive GB before they jumped from 10,000 feet, free-falling for 5,000 feet in 25 seconds. Adam said, "It was nerve racking going up but once you're up there, there is nothing you can do except go ahead with it. Your stomach goes as you go over the edge of the plane but you have to keep your eyes open as you don't want to miss anything!"

Carole said, "I thoroughly enjoyed it and didn't even think about going over the edge because I didn't want to let anyone down. Adam was fantastic and gave me a lot of support and encouragement".

Together with friends and family and with other events they have organised they have managed to raise £4,828 for the Multiple Sclerosis society.
