

Town Council disappointed over Brough South

Update on the Brough South development by Bryan Davis, Chairman of Elloughton-cum-Brough Town Council.

In April 2012 the East Riding of Yorkshire Council (ERYC) Strategic Planning Committee gave outline planning approval for the "Brough South" development. As stated in the last edition of the *Petuarium Press*, the ERYC has not involved the Town Council in any discussions concerning the effects of the approval. All discussions have been between the ERYC, the developers and the statutory agencies

The Town Council's objections are numerous, but our major concern has always been traffic volumes and traffic management. Surprisingly ERYC Highways, and the Highways Agency, consider that only "minor improvements" are necessary to the road network. Their only significant proposal is that the Welton Low Road/Welton Road traffic lights should be replaced with a roundabout.

The Town Council strongly disagrees with their views and consider them to be wholly inadequate. It is obvious to us who live here that access to the A63 is the crucial issue given that it is the only way into, or out of, our community. We have repeatedly lobbied for improvements to the A63 slip roads, but the Highways Agency see no necessity. We have also repeatedly lobbied for access to be made from the "Brough South" development through to the Melton interchange, but the ERYC dismiss this as being impractical and unnecessary. Note that the "Brough Relief Road" that is repeatedly quoted as being part of the planning approval, is NOT a link

through to the Melton Interchange, but is simply the extension of Moor Road over the railway line to gain access to the "Brough South" development.

The final stage in this planning fiasco is that the Secretary of State (Eric Pickles) chose not to intervene, so the "Brough South" development has now effectively been given approval and our concerns re traffic, infrastructure, service provision and quality of life have been ignored. The whole process has been unsatisfactory and against any concept of 'Localism'.

So what should we do next? As a community we need to pull together and get actively involved with the Liaison Group that the developers are required to set up. We need to let the developers, and the ERYC, know at every stage what the consequences of their actions will be. The Town Council will endeavour to keep residents of Elloughton and Brough informed as to what is happening regarding "Brough South", so please keep looking at our website or speak to any Town Councillor.

Big Lottery funds village hall car park

Councillor Kate Brogden of Elloughton cum Brough Town Council is delighted to announce that the Town Council has been awarded a grant of £8,700 from the Big Lottery Fund to cover the cost of resurfacing the car park at the Village Hall on Elloughton Road, Brough. Users of the Village Hall will be aware that the car park surface had become increasingly uneven to the point where it could have constituted a trip hazard. Both the town councillors and village hall trustees were becoming very concerned for the safety of those users and it was clear that remedial work was required. Thanks to Awards for All, England, the car park has now been resurfaced. The work has been carried out by local family-run company Scientific Roads. The Town Council and the Village Hall Management Committee are very grateful for their prompt response and the great job they have done.

Centurion unveiled

Elloughton-cum-Brough In Bloom has brought history to life with the installation of a Roman centurion sculpture at Brough crossroads. The statue made by the late Brantingham artist Rodney Wilson has been erected on the north west corner of Brough crossroads on Welton Road. It is the result of extensive fundraising by In Bloomers, including sales from their naked Bloomers calendar which raised £1500.

Planning permission was eventually granted in September of 2012 after many barriers were overcome. Elloughton-cum-Brough In Bloom obtained the necessary licence from East Riding of Yorkshire Council in May and the statue was unveiled in June.

Sadly, Rodney Wilson who created the sculpture died only a few days after its completion. In Bloom have included a plaque in his memory.

Dog fouling on the increase

The Town Council continues to receive complaints about dog fouling. This persistent problem is getting out of hand again, particularly along The Burrs road.

East Riding of Yorkshire Council had over 500 complaints last year, but councillors say this is "just the tip of the iceberg".

ERYC is now considering giving Parking Enforcement Officers the power to hand out tickets for dog fouling in the East Riding. The proposal

has been referred to the ERYC Scrutiny Committee. More than 15,000 parking tickets have been handed out in 12 months by the new parking wardens, in contrast to two fixed penalty notices for dog fouling from dog wardens.

A £75 fixed penalty notice would send out a strong message to the minority of irresponsible dog owners who do not clean up. Owners who fail to clean up dog mess can currently be reported on 396301.
