

Brough waves bye bye to Buccaneer gate guardian

The Yorkshire Air Museum received the donation of the Blackburn Buccaneer XV168 from BAE Systems which stood at the gates of the Brough factory for 20 years.

The aircraft was transported by road from Skillings Lane, Brough to its new home at Elvington on Sunday 18th August setting out at 7am. Despite an early start several local residents were out to witness the aircraft's departure.

The Buccaneer was the last true Blackburn aircraft to be designed and constructed at the Brough site which was established by Yorkshire aviation pioneer Robert Blackburn back in 1916.

This particular aircraft was dedicated in memory of the factory aircrew who gave their lives during its development. These were: John G Joyce; Trevor D Dunn; 'Sailor' G R I Parker and Gordon R Copeman

Redevelopment of the Brough site led to

a decision being taken to offer the airframe to the Yorkshire Air Museum & Allied Air Forces Memorial. The Buccaneer underwent development trials at Elvington Airfield, so there is an historic connection to XV168's new location.

A re-dedication ceremony will be held once the aircraft is settled in situ at the museum and relatives of the aircrew mentioned above will be invited to attend.

Site director Jim Welsh said, "The relocation of these two companies will help to create and sustain jobs for this area for the future."
