Chairman's update by Bryan Davis, Chairman, Elloughton-cum-Brough Town Council

I have indicated in the past that the so called 'Brough South' development would be overseen by a Liaison Group. The developers have now reached agreement with East Riding of Yorkshire Council on the outstanding planning details so the Liaison Group can now be established.

I must make it clear that its make-up and constitution are not in line with the wishes of the Town Council. Firstly I maintain that the Town Council should have been included in earlier discussions concerning those aspects of the planning approval that directly affect existing residents. Secondly the structure of the Liaison Group hardly inspires me with confidence. The overview is that the Liaison Group will be administered by the developers and will include representatives from the developers, ERYC Officers, the Town Council, Welton Parish Council plus Dale & South Hunsley Ward Councillors. The group chairman must

be elected from the democratically elected members. Meetings must be held in public.

So there we have it; a less than satisfactory set-up but at least we have a platform on which to express our views and to explain directly what impact the 'Brough South' development is having through its various stages. Please keep checking the Town Council website for dates, times and venues and please support by attending meetings.

Finally, I have received both good and bad comments recently about litter picking. For many years the Parish Council employed someone to sweep and litter pick but the days of one man with a barrow trying to cover the whole area are long gone. We now have an arrangement with the ERYC for both road and footpath cleaning. Unfortunately, there was a period in late March/early April when ERYC had problems with their mechanical sweepers. However, they were back on track by mid-April and the Town Council will continue to monitor the service.

Hull City Council boundary proposals

You may have read in the local press that Hull City Council has asked for its boundaries to be extended to take in what it considers to be the built-up area. Somewhat surprisingly this includes as far out as Elloughton-cum-Brough. As a consequence the ERYC proposes to hold a postal ballot for all those potentially affected. At the time of writing it is proposed that Ballot Papers will be sent out on 8th September 2014 to be returned by 26th September 2014. If you have a view on whether Elloughton-cum-Brough ought to be part of the City of Hull it is very important that you use your postal vote to express your opinion. A low return of ballot papers could be used to say that we don't care either way. Additionally I expect that the Town Council will be asked for an opinion. I am currently seeking legal advice re what the Town Council can and can't do in respect of canvassing on this issue, but I anticipate that I will call a public meeting nearer the ballot date to seek your opinions. In the mean time feel free to email me to let me know what you think.

Elloughton-cum-Brough is one of thirteen towns eligible for grants from East Riding of Yorkshire Council's new High Street Fund launched on 24th June.

The aim of the fund is to improve town centres through regeneration activity. Groups can apply for a grant of between £2,000 and £5,000. This amount is doubled for partnerships of two or more groups. Applicants will need to demonstrate that local resources

are also being invested and there are robust arrangements for delivering the proposals.

Funding will be made available through three bidding rounds. Expressions of interest for the first round are required by 25th July and full applications by 5th September.
