Chairman's update

Some time ago I wrote about litter picking and the challenge of keeping our streets clean and tidy. For many years a single worker, equipped with brush, shovel and wheelbarrow was sufficient. Our massive expansion over the past few years has clearly magnified the problem and makes clearance ever more difficult.

Our arrangement with the East Riding of Yorkshire Council to undertake mechanical sweeping on a three week cycle has been a partial success in that our parish now has full coverage. However we have found that mechanical sweeping fails to fully clear litter from hedge bottoms, flower beds or shop frontages. As a consequence, in central parts of Brough and Elloughton, we have recently undertaken additional manual litter picks.

So, what do we do in the long term?

Comparison with similar sized communities is very interesting. Whilst some smaller parishes do indeed employ litter pickers, the current approach by larger parishes and towns is either to set-up voluntary litter picking schemes or to rely totally on the ERYC. Both Cottingham and Hessle have schemes where self-organised groups of residents meet approximately once a month and clear specific areas.

Before trying to launch a voluntary litter picking scheme I want to seek your opinion and make a judgement if the idea could work here in Brough and Elloughton. NEWS·IN·BRIEF

▶ The new £3m South Hunsley Primary is to open next year in a temporary home. From September 2015 the new primary school will run from a building at South Hunsley School for the first year until it's permanent home on the new Brough South development is built.

▶ **Brough resident Mandy Raper held a fundraising event at her house. The cake sale, raffle, tombola and book sale was in aid of Macmillan Cancer Support and the Daisy Appeal. First prize was a £40 voucher for Medici's restaurant donated by Karl Raper. Other prizes were donated by Morrisons, Funky Fish, Wilko Retail, Sainsbury's and Primark. The £246.60 raised will go towards running costs of the new cancer unit at Castle Hill.**

▶ East Riding of Yorkshire Council's YORSwitch initiative aims to help residents and businesses save money on their gas and electricity bills. YORSwitch does not guarantee to save participants money, it simply offers a hassle-free, no-obligation method to find out if you could be paying less. The benefit of your offer is that it gives you peace of mind that you are not paying too much for your energy. The scheme is approaching its seventh round and it is free to register. To date nearly 4,000 residents have switched supplier using the scheme, saving over £580,000 on their bills. Registration is free and there is no obligation to change energy supplier. Visit the website at www.eastriding.gov.uk/yorswitch before 2nd February.

▶ **In September over 3,000 tonnes of recycling were collected in blue bins in the East Riding – the highest figure ever in one month. This represents an increase of around 18 per cent over the same month last year. Blue bins can now be used to recycle a range of items including newspapers, magazines, cardboard, books, envelopes and clean beverage cartons. Blue bins can also be used for plastic bottles, clean yoghurt pots, margarine tubs, steel and aluminium cans, empty aerosol cans, glass bottles and jars.**

▶ More than 10,000 East Riding residents have taken up the offer of the free NHS checks offered to people aged between 40 and 74 years, to assess heart health and the risk of developing diabetes, heart disease, kidney disease, stroke and dementia.

Exhibition tells tales from World War I



Where are all the pumping stations?

Yorkshire Water is appealing for help to identify the locations of any local private sewage pumping stations.

Under new legislation ownership of these private stations will automatically transfer to Yorkshire Water from 1st October 2016. This is good news for private individuals as they will no longer be responsible for the maintenance and repair of the stations.

It is estimated that there are more than 700 private pumping stations in our region but the locations of them all is not known.
