## New pieces for Elloughton Road play park

New equipment has been installed at the Village Hall playground and local children are seen here enjoying the new experiences.

A single, very outdated item has been replaced by five new and exciting rides. These new pieces of apparatus were chosen by village children. They were canvassed with lots of different brochures and then voted for their favourites.

The installation was funded with £10,000 from the Town Council and a £15,000 grant from the Landfill Communities Fund operated by Waste Recycling Environmental Limited (WREN).

Youngsters from Brough School, Brough Guides and St Mary's Church wrote letters of support which were submitted to WREN with the grant application. WREN is a non-profit making environmental body established in 1997 and registered to fund projects which are eligible under the Landfill Communities Fund.

## Don't fall foul of defecation legislation!

An irresponsible minority of dog owners continues to ignore their legal obligations and duty to public health by failing to clean up after their animals in public.

An article highlighting this problem in the last edition of *Petuarria Press* incorrectly quoted from the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996 which has been superseded by the Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act 2005. This later legislation allows local authorities to make orders for the control of dogs for certain specified offences.

The East Riding of Yorkshire Council's Fouling Of Land By Dogs Order 2009 makes it an offence for any person in charge of a dog who fails to clean up immediately after the dog defecates. This applies on any land in the open air within the East Riding of Yorkshire to which public have access either with or without payment. As a result a fixed penalty notice of £75 may be issued.

The order does not apply to people registered as blind or disabled people who rely on an assistance dog which has been trained by a prescribed charity.

## New benches needed

The old concrete and wood benches in the village are rapidly deteriorating and are in need of replacement. Following a decision by the Village Environment Committee the Town Council has agreed to replace the bench at the corner of Freeman Avenue. However there are nine others at various locations around Elloughton and Brough.

As BAE Systems scales down its presence on the former factory site on Saltgrounds Road, work continues in preparation for further development of the new Humber Enterprise Park.

Nearby residents will be aware of the recent demolition and site-clearing work on south-western corner of the site close to the car park and viewing area at Brough Haven.

Following the flattening of the various wind-tunnel buildings in this area, the latest round of deconstruction involves the squashing of the old squash courts at the northern end of the BAE Systems site near to Skillings Lane.

Originally built for use by pilots and aircrew stationed on the site during the war,
