BRINGING PEOPLE AND BUSINESS TOGETHER

Working in conjunction with the Town Council, the Petuaria Community Forum has been awarded a grant of £6,043 from the East Riding of Yorkshire Council's High Street Fund. The grant will support a number of projects aimed at stimulating visits to Brough and Elloughton and enhancing the business community. NEWS·IN·BRIEF

- ▶ Cafe Indulge took part in Macmillan Cancer Support's Worlds Biggest Coffee Morning in September. Ten pence from every cup of coffee sold was donated to the charity.
- ▶ **Alzheimer's Society Hull and East Riding now have a Dementia Adviser outreach service based at Brough Medical Practice on Mondays. The advisers give information, support and advice. To make an appointment call 211255.**
- ▶ The Environment Agency has confirmed levels of potentially toxic Blue-green Algae in the boating lake at Welton Waters. Blooms of the algae can produce toxins which can be fatal to wild animals and domestic pets. In humans rashes may occur following contact and illness can result if algae is swallowed. Levels are reported as being only slight, but dog walkers are advised to keep their dogs out of the water.
- ▶ **Brough Community Centre main hall is having new flooring and lighting fitted. The work to replace the existing water-damaged floor is scheduled for October now that a prolonged problem with rain leakage has been remedied.**
- ▶ Elloughton Village Hall has received a further grant of £1,906.68 from the Big Lottery Fund. The money will pay for the installation of new security lights and exterior lighting.

Chairman's report

In response to the Town Council's latest letter to the East Riding of Yorkshire Council (ERYC) and Highways England regarding queuing traffic on the A63, 'Queue Ahead' warning signs have been installed and traffic lights adjusted.

ERYC is required by central government to identify land for residential development, giving priority to locations with existing or proposed services and good public transport and highway connections. ERYC feels our community has good access east and west onto the A63 and frequent rail services. They say there have been improvements in infrastructure in recent years with a new primary school, health centre, customer service centre and shopping facilities. As part of future planning approvals ERYC assures us they will continue to seek improvements to service and transport infrastructure, including capacity increases at the A63 junctions.

We will continue to make representations to ERYC on highways issues. Our main concern is congestion, parking, speeding and the impact of further housing developments. ERYC has carried out several surveys on parking and speeding. Parking restrictions have been implemented but unfortunately the speed survey statistics did not justify the implementation of speed restrictions.

The 'Transport Assessment' for the development north of

Welton Low Road identified the need for improvements to traffic lights above the A63. Work should begin in the near future.

Developers of the 'Brough South' development are required to:

- Improve the highway network, taking traffic away from the centre of Brough and a new signalised roundabout to improve access to and from the A63;
- Improve efficiency of the signals controlling access from the A63 westbound to reduce vehicle queueing;
- Provide a 'Travel Plan' to reduce single occupancy car usage and promote sustainable transport modes.
- Provide traffic monitoring equipment to establish if the developer's predictions match the actual traffic flows when the development is built.

Main access to the Brough South development will be from Moor Road. Work on the highway infrastructure and bridge should begin this Autumn for Spring completion.
