NEWS·IN·BRIEF

▶ East Riding primary schools are celebrating their best ever outcomes for pupils at Key Stage 2. The East Riding is top of the table in the Yorkshire and Humber region for the second year running and is now 44th in the national rankings, from a total of 152 local authorities.

▶ Residents will soon be receiving new bin collection calendars through the post from East Riding of Yorkshire Council which will show the collection dates for 2016. A free text reminder service the night before collection is available. For information on how to sign up visit www.eastriding.gov.uk and search 'bin collection dates'.

▶ Free biodegradable bin liners for kitchen caddies are now available from ERYC household waste recycling sites, customer service centres, leisure centres and libraries.

▶ Businesses on Half Acres Industrial Estate were hit by a large fire in November. An electrical fault started the blaze which was tackled by 30 firefighters. Nine appliances were in attendance and the fire was brought under control in the early hours of the morning. MRD Garages Ltd and Brough Body Repairs suffered severe and extensive damage. The Automotive Repair Company was also affected.

Mission Day at Methodist Church


Brough Methodist Church held a Mission Day in November which took place during the regular Saturday Coffee Morning in the new Welcome Centre. Church groups and other groups that meet on the premises provided a small display about the work they do.

The objective was to spread awareness within the community and promote the services being offered to help enrich lives. A special 'Thank You' celebration service was held the following Sunday for the congregation to thank the various groups for their work.

A scale model of an aircraft upon which the factory site at Brough was founded is to return to the skies a century after its first flight.

Engineers at BAE Systems are building a third-scale seven-metre wingspan model of the Special Purpose Seaplane, designed and built by the Blackburn Aircraft company back in 1916. The project is one of a number which will be undertaken next year as the Brough site celebrates its centenary.

The model will include 3D cameras linked to a headset on the ground using datalink technology. Completion is expected by February 2016. You can follow the project's progress on its website at blackburnflyers.co.uk.

Big plans at Brough business park

A dramatic new look has been unveiled for the Humber Enterprise Park, formerly part of the BAE Systems site in Brough.

Plans include a hi-tech hub with offices, factories, a heritage centre and running track. The owners hope the development will create 1,500 jobs.

Humber Fire & Rescue Service will use part of the site to build a new station. Its old base will be transformed into a heritage centre featuring a vintage biplane and other artefacts from the site's aeronautical past. Other plans that have been discussed include allotments, landscaped gardens and all-year-round open air barbecue facilities.

Tenants on the site include metal fabricator RexRob Engineering, military wiring firm Cablesan and aerospace engineer Supercraft.

Hunsley swimming pool is to close

The Hunsley Trust Board has decided to close the swimming pool at South Hunsley and instead develop the space as a multifunctional area for students.

The decision was announced in a letter to parents and follows lengthy campaigning to save the pool and objections from local residents and town and parish councils.

The pool was built in the 1960s and is beyond its original life expectancy. To bring the pool up to a required standard would

cost over £250,000 and the board say that the space is needed for additional facilities to keep up with the growing population. The development will provide additional kitchen and dining facilities, PE curriculum space, an exam and assembly hall and space for community use out of school hours. It will also ensure that all students in the school's catchment area will be able to attend South Hunsley School for several years to come.

Transwaste donate new facility to St Anne's

Local companies have donated a new meeting and training room to St Anne's Community Special School and Sixth Form College. Provision of the facility is the result of a collaboration between Transwaste, Humberside Aggregates and Hobson & Porter.

Transwaste was approached by the school to assist with the provision of a modular building. The company were able to source a specially modified building with the help of their business partners.

St Anne's caters for children and young adults between the ages of 2 and 19 with severe and complex needs. It is one of only three special schools within the East Riding.

St Anne's wins awards

St Anne's School and Sixth Form College has been awarded the E-Safety Mark for its safeguarding policies and procedures, training, technical security and E-safety education, which were judged to have reached the benchmark level in all aspects.

The school has also been awarded the Eco-Schools Green Flag award having been involved in a range of projects which have led to significant improvements in saving energy, encouraging biodiversity, increasing recycling and reducing waste and litter.
