

Public access defibrillators could save lives

Defibrillators have been installed at two locations in the village for use by the public in the event of a medical emergency.

One defibrillator has been installed in Elloughton on the outside wall of the East Yorkshire Motor Services bus depot and the second is located outside Brough Methodist Church on Welton Road.

After a cardiac arrest, every minute without CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) and defibrillation reduces someone's chance of survival by 10 per cent. A defibrillator delivers a high energy electric shock, which when given to the heart in some types of cardiac arrest, may restore a more stable

rhythm. During a 999 call the emergency operator will release a code that gives access to the defibrillator. The operator will then talk the user through its use.

Our community is so large and widespread that two defibrillators are needed. Their purchase and installation has been paid for with money from the East Riding of Yorkshire Council Local Grant after a successful funding bid by the Town Council

A familiarisation event for residents is to be held at 7.30pm at United Reformed Church School Room in Elloughton on Tuesday 12th April and another will be held at 7.30pm at Brough Methodist Church on Wednesday 20th April.

Town Council vote to acquire civic regalia

As reported in the last issue of *Petuarria Press*, Elloughton-cum-Brough Town Council agreed in principle to acquire a chain of office for the Chairman as a way of raising the town's profile. The Town Council sought residents' views through a survey in the *Petuarria Press*.

At its February Meeting the Council Chairman reported that 156 people had been against the purchase of civic regalia with 15 in favour. Councillors discussed

the survey along with an offer, by an anonymous donor, to provide regalia and agreed by a majority, recorded vote, to accept the donation.

At its March meeting the Town Council decided by a majority, with a recorded vote, to spend up to £2500 to make up a complete set of regalia for the town to be used on civic occasions. The regalia will comprise two pendants, two ribbons and a silver chain.

Irresponsible dog owners come under fire

Residents continue to raise their concerns over the ongoing problem of dog fouling. It is particularly prevalent on Brantingham Road, Dale Road and Main Street to the north of Elloughton crossroads. The grass areas on Church Street and in front of the Half Moon are also badly affected.

There are dog waste bins in all of these areas. The main culprits are the few irresponsible owners who do not clean up



after their animals but responsible dog owners are also reminded to be vigilant when their dogs are not on a leash. Fouling can go unnoticed while owners' backs are turned.

The Town Council does not have powers of prosecution but East Riding of Yorkshire Council does. If there are specific days, times and locations that offenders allow their dogs to foul and do not clean up, ERYC dog wardens can try and catch them in the act. Further events are planned for later in the year. Fostering can be a very rewarding experience and free professional training is given. Prospective foster carers should ideally be over 25, they can be single, married or co-habiting. People with or without families, heterosexual, lesbian or gay, can be foster carers. The legislation is designed to help East Riding of Yorkshire Council's dog wardens and vets to reunite lost pets with their owners. Micro-chipping can be carried out by your local vet. The only exemption to the new law is where a dog cannot be chipped for health reasons, in which case your vet will be required to issue a certificate. Owners whose dogs are already chipped should ensure their contact details, including a telephone number, are kept up-to-date.
