

## Be sure to have your say in our library's future

**A public consultation has opened on proposals by East Riding of Yorkshire Council for the future of its libraries and multi service centres.**

If approved, the cost-cutting proposals will severely affect the availability and services provided by ERYC at the Petuaria Centre in Brough. Opening hours could be reduced from 49 hours per week to just 26. Our library is currently open until 8pm on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Under the new proposals there would be no provision any later than 6.30pm and this would only be on one day per week.

The proposals also include a streamlining of customer services. The current walk-in provision would become predominantly self service with a surgery style service for dealing with more complex enquiries.

The consultation period is running until



3rd August. The Petuaria Centre has been an important focal point for the community since it was first opened ten years ago this August. Residents are encouraged to take part whether they are users of the library and service centre or not. ## New Brough support group for stroke patients

**A support group for stroke patients is being launched in Brough to provide friendship and local support.**

Tracy Webb, Community Stroke Support Worker at Humber Foundation NHS Trust is launching the group with the help of two stroke patients and a patient's wife.

The group, which will meet once a month, aims to put stroke patients in touch with one another at what can be a very lonely and difficult time.

Tracey said, "When a patient is discharged from hospital our service supports them at home and their families or carers. But I can't put patients in touch with one another for

confidentiality reasons.

"The purpose of the group is for patients to meet and share friendship. We have a lot of stroke patients in the area and it's a chance for them to meet up, especially those who live alone."

There will be activities and guest speakers arranged for group members. Stroke patients from the surrounding villages will all be welcomed too.

The first meeting of the group will take place on Thursday 28th July between 1pm and 3pm at the Petuaria Centre. Subsequent meetings will take place on the last Thursday of every month.

## Grants for Village Hall improvements

**Elloughton Village Hall trustees have been awarded a £3,590 grant from WREN. The money will cover the cost of new high capacity gutters and down pipes.**

Funds will also go towards the cost of replacing the ramp at the main entrance. Work will be undertaken at the end of July. WREN is a not-for-profit business that helps communities close to landfill sites by awarding grants for local improvements.

The Atkinson Trust has also very kindly donated £500 which will be used to fund the new ramp. The remaining balance will go towards the cost of new flooring for the building's main entrance which will be completed in August. Flooring at the side entrance was replaced last year.

The aging light fittings and bulbs have now been replaced with modern LED lighting which will reduce ongoing electricity costs. This was made possible through a donation from Elloughton-cum-Brough Town Council.

- ▶ **Dog wardens across the East Riding have issued more fixed penalty notices to owners who fail to clean up after their pets in the first six months of this year compared to the same period last year. Between January 2016 and the end of May 2016 dog wardens from East Riding of Yorkshire Council handed out the £75 fixed penalty notices to 11 owners, compared to just eight in the first half of 2015. Dog wardens rely on quality information from the public in order to find those responsible for not cleaning up after their pets. ## New evidence of Roman remains beneath the Burrs

**A public seminar at the Village Hall on Sunday 17th July will give residents the opportunity to learn about the results of a recent archeological survey on Burrs Playing Field in Brough.**

Starting at 3pm, Dr Peter Halkon from the University of Hull will present the latest evidence of Brough's historical significance as the Roman settlement known as Petuaria. Dr Halkon and his team conducted an advanced geophysical investigation which builds on earlier work carried out in the 1930s and 1980s. There is clear evidence of a Roman fort and probably an amphitheatre, with the settlement extending beyond the fort along what is now Cave Road and Petuaria Close.

The hour long presentation will be followed by questions and an optional site visit to the Burrs to see actual locations of the buried remains. The event raises the question as to whether the community should apply to the Heritage Lottery Fund for a grant to support excavation of the remains and the construction of a permanent public display.

## Council tax – are you paying too much?

**East Riding of Yorkshire Council is campaigning to raise awareness of unclaimed council tax benefits.**

Many people know that a discount is available for those who live on their own. What they may not know is that there is a range of other conditions under which joint occupants may qualify for a council tax discount.

Full time carers and people who receive various disability or attendance allowances may be eligible to claim a reduction. There is also a reduction available for people with mental health problems.

## Turpin legend comes to life

The story of highwayman Dick Turpin, perhaps Brough's most infamous resident, is being brought to life in a new film trilogy.

Members of the English Cinematic Pictures production company appeared at the Ferry Inn for a screening of the first part of the story. The presentation featured costumes and props including replica flintlock pistols and a blunderbuss used in the movie.



The Ferry Inn is documented as being a former residence of Dick Turpin when he was living in the village under the alias of John Palmer. The landlord of the day betrayed Turpin to the authorities which ultimately led to the villain's capture and subsequent hanging at York.

Filmmaker Dale Nichol has funded much of the production from his own pocket. "We are still filming parts two and three and we're always on the lookout for locations," he said. "It's really important to use places like this that have a connection to Turpin's life as it adds authenticity!"
