

## Petuarria Community Award scheme for volunteers

**Elloughton-cum-Brough Town Council is launching a new award scheme.**

The Petuarria Community Award will recognise the hard work and determination of volunteers in Elloughton and Brough and celebrate those who selflessly give up their time for the benefit of the community. The award will be made annually to individuals who will receive a glass trophy to keep and a shield to hold for the year.

To qualify for consideration nominees must live in the parish. They must also be doing, or have done voluntary work

here. Any projects involved must operate on a non-commercial basis. A panel will meet in March to draw up a shortlist and decide on the winner. Shortlisted nominees will be invited to an awards ceremony at the Annual Art & Photography Exhibition which will be held at the Petuarria Centre on the weekend of 12th-14th May 2017. Nomination forms may be obtained from the Town Council office on 665600 or downloaded from [www.elloughtonbrough-pc.gov.uk](http://www.elloughtonbrough-pc.gov.uk) and must be returned by 28th February 2017.

## Community project hopes to reveal Roman Brough

**Dr Peter Halkon, Senior Lecturer in Archaeology at the University of Hull, gave a talk on Roman Brough at the Village Hall earlier this summer.**

He was accompanied by James Lyle who presented the results of a geophysical survey he conducted on Burrs Field in 2014 which reveals evidence of buildings and fortifications. After the talk a short workshop was held on Burrs Field to mark out the probable locations of where the Roman wall and bastions once stood.

Brough is built on the site of a significant Roman settlement on the main route between Lincoln and York. Many artefacts such as military buttons, spearheads and pottery have been found in the area.

The Town Council has formed a working party, which includes councillors and Chris Hannard (see below), to work with the Playing Fields Association and Historic England. Dr Halkon will be on the panel as a consultant. The aim is to set up a community heritage project and seek funding from the Heritage Lottery Fund to provide a permanent exhibition. Permission will also be sought for play equipment for the 11+ age range on The Burrs, preferably

a zip wire. The field would still be available to local football teams.

In the 1930s an archeological dig was carried out on the Burrs by Philip Corder, revealing a section of wall which probably formed part of the town boundary. Villagers of the time would have lived outside these walls in the area covered by modern Brough.

If you would like to help bring Roman Brough to life please register your interest with Councillor Tony Galbraith on 668381. You can also carry out your own 'Time Team' style dig with a one metre square test pit in your garden. It may not be just Roman artefacts that you unearth – Saxon, Viking and Victorian items are sometimes found.

## Local archeologist will help to identify your finds

**For the last 40 years Brough resident Chris Hannard has been digging up ancient artefacts and objects of interest in the locality.**

Using a metal detector and with the permission of local landowners Chris has uncovered some amazing finds including Roman coins and brooches. Despite being over 2,000 years old, some of the jewellery he has found is still gilded or enamelled. He has also found non-metallic items such as Bronze Age arrowheads, Neolithic flints and mediaeval and Victorian pottery.

One of Chris's favourite finds is a Greenstone axe head. This stone is only

found in Cumbria where a Neolithic industry grew up making axe heads. Examples of these have been found all over the country.

The project is being funded by an East Riding of Yorkshire Council commuted sums project. Work includes three springers and a dish roundabout for toddlers, the addition of more seating and another picnic table, all with grass matting. Many children have enjoyed the new equipment over the summer holidays.

The safety surface has been renewed under both sets of swings and the seesaw has been refurbished. The project also included replacement safety fencing, a gate to the car park and an additional litter bin.

## NEWS·IN·BRIEF

▶ BAE Systems' Brough Centenary Day was held in September at the company's site on Saltgrounds Road. The factory was open for tours and there were a number of attractions on site with an air display throughout the afternoon. Highlights included a flypast by the Eurofighter Typhoon and the Battle of Britain Memorial Flight which included a Hurricane, Spitfire and Lancaster. Established by Robert Blackburn in 1916, the site is the world's longest continually operated aircraft manufacturing facility.

▶ Schools in the East Riding celebrated their best ever GCSE results. South Hunsley topped the table with the highest results of any East Riding school. This year's results used a new set of measures from previous years but figures show significantly improved performances in a year when there has been a national dip in results for English and maths.

▶ The Ridings Medical Group is holding a series of walk-in flu clinics at Brough Surgery. No appointment is necessary. Vaccinations are available to all patients registered with the practice who are aged 65 or over or are in a high risk group. Children aged 2-4 are also eligible. The clinics are from 1.30pm to 6.00pm on Wednesday 5th and Thursday 20th October, and Tuesday 8th November.

▶ The Unity Youth Group is to relaunch but desperately needs adult volunteers. The group for ages 11+ will meet on Tuesdays between 6.30pm and 8.30pm at Blackburn Leisure. ## New public use defibrillator

**A new public use defibrillator has been installed outside Elloughton Village Hall in Brough. The life-saving equipment has been purchased with funds provided by the Atkinson Foundation.**



There are now three such machines in the area with one at Elloughton bus depot and the other at the Methodist Church on Welton Road in Brough. They can be accessed by dialling 999 when you will be given a code to open the box and instructions on how to use the defibrillator.

## Dry feet and more cameras

Further work on Elloughton Village Hall has now been completed. High capacity gutters and down pipes have been installed and a the ramp at the main entrance has been replaced. As a result users will no longer have to wade through water during inclement weather.

The trustees are grateful to WREN and the Atkinson Foundation for their grants which enabled this essential work to be carried out. The Atkinson Foundation have also contributed towards the cost of new flooring in the main entrance.

Additional CCTV cameras are being installed following a spate of vandalism which resulted in extensive damage to the fibre glass roof, new guttering and down pipes. Fires have also been lit behind the hall. The new cameras will extend coverage to include the entire area around the Village Hall as well as equipment in the nearby play park.
