Dodgy distribution ends delivery of Petuarria Press

The *Petuarria Press* will no longer be delivered to the 4,500 homes in Elloughton-cum-Brough.

The next edition to be published in October will only be available online and by email. A limited print edition will still be available for free from selected local retail outlets and the Town Council office on Skillings Lane.

The *Petuarria Press* was launched in 1999 by the original editor Tony Barker who identified a need for a local newspaper when he first moved to the village. He approached what was then the Parish

Council who agreed to fund a quarterly publication. Since then it has been delivered free to residents' homes.

Following difficulties in finding a reliable distributor, the door-to-door delivery of recent editions has been undertaken by Town Councillors. Unfortunately this has proven to be unsustainable. It has been decided that future editions will be made available by email and online at <http://petuariapress.co.uk>.

Petuarria Revisited: Dig is still on track

Plans to excavate the Burrs Playing Field are still on track. A recent survey indicates that there is the possibility of uncovering extensive Roman remains.

Following an informal application to the Heritage Lottery Fund, a more detailed plan will now be considered. This may include a permanent on-site exhibition if sufficient finds are unearthed.

The Town Council in partnership with the Playing Field Association, which owns Burrs field, will apply to the "Our Heritage" fund later this summer. The fund can provide grants in the range of £10,000 to £100,000.

NEWS·IN·BRIEF

▶ Local firm Jesmond Engineering was recognised for its achievements at the East Riding of Yorkshire Council Chairman's Awards. The company, based in Brough Business Centre on Skillings Lane, came runner up in the Chairman's Business Award for businesses with fewer than 50 employees.

▶ **Golf loving Michele Moran, Chief Executive of Humber NHS Foundation Trust, paid a flying visit to Brough Golf Club as part of a challenge to help the charity Health Stars. Ms Moran set out to play as many par three holes in the HU postcode area as she could between sunrise and sunset on the longest day of the year. The 53 holes on 14 courses started at 4.25am in Cherry Burton.**

▶ East Riding of Yorkshire Council's annual compost giveaways enjoyed one of their most successful years yet – with 5,000 bags given away free to residents. Ten giveaway events were held across the East Riding during May, including one at Brantingham Park in Elloughton. The compost has been recycled from the garden and food waste that residents put into their brown bins.

▶ **New warning signs are to be placed at litter hotspots across the East Riding as part of a campaign to combat the growing problem of roadside rubbish. East Riding of Yorkshire Council will be placing yellow signs on verges with a clear message to drivers to 'Take Your Litter Home'. The signs will also inform drivers how much rubbish the council's litter pickers have collected along that particular route.**

▶ People who took part in the latest home energy-switching scheme by East Riding of Yorkshire Council are being offered average household savings of £190. In the East Riding, more than 6,000 households registered with the YORSwitch this round and these were combined with a number of other similar initiatives driven by more than 72 local authorities around the UK to create a collective of more than 55,000 households.

▶ **Brough's newest pub opened in June. The Centurion Arms on Skillings Lane is a micropub – an establishment that mainly serves cask ales, promotes conversation, shuns all forms of electronic entertainment and dabbles in traditional pub snacks.**

Pupils' poppies go on parade at Welton church

A display of poppies made by local school children has gone on display at Saint Helen's Church in Welton.

The work was inspired by the poppies of Hull's Weeping Window, itself part of an installation entitled *Blood Swept Lands and Seas Of Red* originally housed at the Tower Of London to commemorate the centenary of the outbreak of World War I.

Pupils at Welton Primary School created their own interpretation which they handed to Welton Church at a special service. The project took

The school raised £17,000 towards the coach, including a significant donation from Railscape Ltd. The bid was matched by local caravan manufacturer ABI (UK) Ltd.


